The Epiphany of Jesus



When you purchase a final resting place in a Catholic Cemetery, you are purchasing the right of "interment", or burial, in the grave, crypt or niche. The cemetery grounds and buildings are owned, managed and maintained by the Diocese of Trenton. In accordance with State laws, we maintain a healthy Perpetual Care fund to care for the cemetery property for years to come. All lawn care and tree/shrub maintenance is performed by cemetery staff.

It is important to note that, with the right of interment, the surface area of a cemetery plot, not inclusive of the approved monument, remains the property of the cemetery.

Cemetery Beautification

Cemetery Beautification will begin the week of January 13th. All grave decorations must be removed prior to the 13th. This clean up allows our staff to prepare the cemetery for winter weather.

All decoration and grave borders will be removed and disgarded.
